Andrew Paul Bebow, affectionately known as "Andy" or "Drew", 49, passed away peacefully on January 2, 2025, at his Bradenton, FL, home.

Ever the life of the party, Andy did not want a traditional memorial service and asked that instead, friends and family come together to share their favorite memories of him and raise a glass in his honor. The family plans to have a private celebration at a later time.

Andy is survived by his son, Graham; his father, Gary (Verona) Bebow; his sister, Ella (Wes) Shelton; and countless other relatives and friends. He was preceded in death by his mother, Cheryl Bebow, and his nephew, Taylor Shelton.

In his too-short life, Andy created lasting memories filled with creativity, music, and joy. He forged incredible friendships, always bringing laughter and light to those around him. Despite life's challenges, Andy was a resilient soul. After losing his mother at the age of 21, he went on to graduate from the University of Florida with a degree in Advertising. He later moved closer to family and began his art and graphic design business. He found a unique way to express his grief through leather sculpting, showcasing his incredible talent and ability to transform any material into art.

At 28, Andy suffered a stroke, just as his son Graham was only 8 months old. Throughout his recovery, Andy showed remarkable strength and perseverance, inspiring fellow patients at the rehab facility. His determination to hold his son again was unwavering, and he ultimately learned to walk once more alongside his growing son.

A proud University of Florida graduate, Andy was a passionate Gator football fan. On game days, he could be found chanting "Go Gators, Come On, Gators, Get Up and Go!" and performing the Gator chomp, often in playful rivalry with Florida State fans.

Known for his great sense of humor and generous spirit, Andy had a knack for striking up conversations with anyone he met. He was always open with his feelings, ensuring those he loved knew how much they meant to him. As expressed in one of his favorite James Taylor songs, "Shower the People," Andy believed in showering the people in his life with love and affection. He will be greatly missed.
