Dale Allen Stevenson, 66, passed away February 16, 2026. He was born October 13, 1959 in Union City, Pennsylvania to Carol Stevenson and the late Russell Stevenson (died in 2024).

Dale came to Sarasota in 1971 and was a lifelong dedicated fan of several Florida sport teams. He loved music and was the longest running fan of Tampa radio station Q105 which was playing when he passed. He had lots of “girlfriends” everywhere his family frequented. He enjoyed outings with his family and made a lasting impact on everyone who knew him. Dale was cared for by his parents until late 2023. A special thank you to his caregivers at Agency for Persons with Disabilities from 2024-2026. Dale lived with many health challenges and chronic pain from having cerebral palsy. But that did not define him, for he was a happy man who loved his family. The sufferings he encountered on Earth are overshadowed by the promise of eternal life with a fully healed body. Philippians 3:22 says “He will take our weak mortal bodies and change them into glorious bodies like His own, using the same power with which He will bring everything under His control.”
