Gail Seibert Weller, 87, passed away March 6, 2024. She was born September 25, 1936 in Union City, New Jersey to the late George Richard (Dick) and Doris (Croker) Seibert.

Gail earned her undergraduate degree in English from the University of Illinois in 1958, gaining a lifelong interest in Art History, and served as the degree's secretary in the Graduate School office at Cornell University where she also received a Ford Fellowship leading to a Teaching Certificate. Gail received her MBA from Western Illinois University in Macomb, Illinois and developed an interest in taxes and helping others, especially farmers and faculty members, with theirs.

She gained her continuing interest in public higher education and politics serving as chair of the SUNY at Fredonia library support committee, as a representative on the Tompkins County Planning committee, and as a State Representative for the League of Women Voters.

While teaching college Accounting and Finance in California, and working toward a Law degree, Gail was active in two local Gourmet dinner groups and was a docent at the Claremont colleges' Wildflower Garden.

Gail and her husband Paul loved to travel the World with Rome, Italy her preferred city and the wonders of Egypt a glowing preference from childhood to a trip in 2010, but her overall favorite was the Around the World trip with her family of four including a four month stay in Australia in 1971-72. Gail and Paul moved to Sarasota from Framingham, Massachusetts in 1996.

Left to cherish her memory are her loving husband of 66 years, Dr. Paul Franklin Weller; sons Mark Charles Weller and his partner Vanita Seth, and David Bruce Weller and his fiancé Angela Henderson; and grandsons Dayan, Matthew and Brendan.
