James Stanley Domanski passed away in Sarasota Florida on December 20th 2024. Jim, as he was known to family and friends, was born in Wyandotte Michigan on January 20th 1959, the youngest child of Donald Domanski and Julianna Stawowy Domanski, who both preceded him in death.

For nearly three decades Jim was well-known in his Royal Oak, Michigan community as an entrepreneur, and co-owner of "Pronto 608!". In 2005 he was named the Royal Oak Chamber of Commerce's "Businessperson of the Year". His love of gardening led him to help create "We Dig Royal Oak" which became the city's annual beautification program. For years he was an Adopt-A-Garden Gardener at the Detroit Zoo in Royal Oak. Jim was active in the community and many organizations benefited from his generosity in time and talent. After retiring he moved to Florida in 2014, and Jim became a supervisor at Costco. In his free time, Jim was an avid fan of the Detroit Tigers (12 years a season ticket holder), and Detroit Lions, and he often attended the Tiger spring training games in Florida. Additionally he could be found gardening, enjoying time with family and friends, and walking the beach. He spear-headed contributions to the Children's Miracle Hospital Network, that Costco sponsored.

Making people happy was Jim's mission in life.

Left to cherish Jim's bright memory are his siblings Theresa Domanski, Ken Domanski and his wife Margaret, Thomas Domanski and his wife Nancy, Dennis Domanski and his wife Dodie, Niece Katelin James, Nephews Brian, Steven and Andrew Domanski, as well as many cousins.

There will be a private family graveside service in his honor at Our Lady of Hope Catholic Cemetery in Brownston, Michigan on a date to be determined by his family.
