cheer on the Chicago Bears in honor of her son.

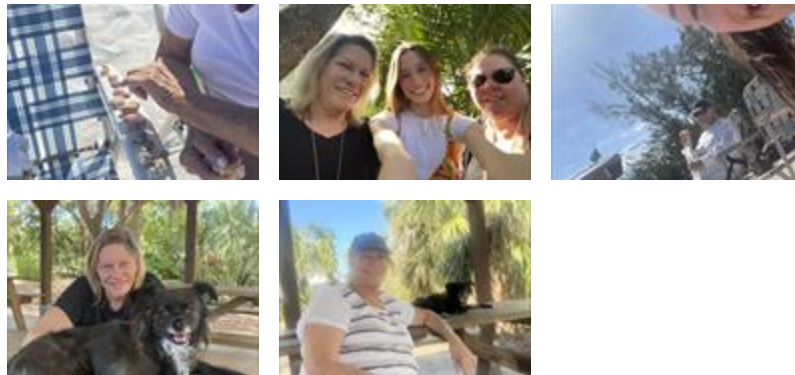
Above all, Judy was an incredibly strong and independent woman who lived her life until the very end in the way she wanted.
