Marlin Eicher was born on May 28, 1973 in Marshfield, Missouri, to Levi and Leona (Graber) Eicher. He passed peacefully at his home in Florida on August 4th, following complications from an aggressive type of prostate cancer in addition to colorectal cancer.

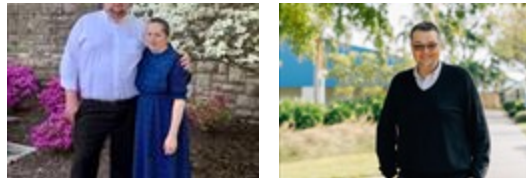
