Richard William Wilson 79, passed on December 23, 2025.

He was born in Newark, New Jersey to the late Frank and Stella Wilson.

He served our country during the Viet Nam War (1967/68) in the United States Marine Corps. He served in Kilo Company, 3rd Battalion 5th Regiment, First Marine Division as a senior radio operator.

He received a Viet Nam Service Medal, National Service Defense Medal, and, Viet Nam Campaign Medal. Richards unit, the 5th marine regiment, was recognized with the Presidential Unit Citation, which is the highest award that a unit can get, for extraordinary heroism and uncommon courage during the fierce engagements of Operation Union in the spring of 1967. He will also receive a Purple Heart Medal.

He was a larger than life character with a booming voice. He gave random bear hugs to friends and family and it made him memorable. His pursuit of humor coupled with his generous random acts of kindness made the world a better place. He loved his family, friends and country fiercely. And he would do anything to help willingly, anytime.

He began his financial career in the Stock Market in N.Y.C. His career spanned 30 plus years in the investment industry as a financial operations manager.

He lived in Boca Raton, Orlando and Weston, Florida during this time. In 2016, his oenophile interests brought him to Northern California where he partnered and maintained a Pinot Noir wine grape vineyard. He was also an avid scuba diver, fisherman and sailor . He settled in Sarasota, Florida in 2018 with his wife Karen. Richard has been a member of the DAV in Sarasota for several years.

Left to cherish his memory is his wife of 8 years Karen Wilson, his two precious daughters Emily Wilson, Christine Clark. His delightful granddaughter Sia Reese Clark, Emily's' fiancé Daniel, son in law Jonathon, multiple beloved cousins in Orlando, Ohio and beyond, cherished friends for many many many years and of course his very special Viet Nam buddies.
