Stephen "Mack" Gerard McAnally passed away on April 16, 2022, at the age of 66. Mack was born July 14, 1955, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to the late Edward and Helen (Arko) McAnally,

Mack proudly served our country for 22 years, earning the Bronze Star during his distinguished career as a Sergeant Major in the United States Army. Later, he went on to serve and retire from the State of Kansas as the Clay County Tax Appraiser.

Mack moved his family to Sarasota from Kansas in 2020. He was raised Catholic and attended Northeast Catholic High School in Philadelphia. He was a member of the local Goldwing Rider's Association. Some of his favorite activities were fishing and riding his motorcycle.

Left to cherish his memory are his wife of 27 years, Dawn; brother, Michael McAnally and other extended family. In addition to his parents, Mack was predeceased by his brother Edward.
