“ I moved from New York to Los Angeles in 1982 and met my future husband Israel within two weeks. He came with a cohort of friends and Stu was among them. Stu was unusual. I quickly learned to love him so, so much. We introduced him to Janabai a rather conservative friend who would often come home and take off her heeled shoes and pearl necklaces after a long-day at work at US Magazine where she was advertising sales executive for US magazine. He was a free-living hippie living in a trailer at the top of Topanga Canyon. To our shock, it was love at first sight. Stu proposed to marry Janabai at the Whiskey Creek in downtown Mammoth Lakes, a world class ski resort, on one of our trips. We were to take many trips and camping trips over time. We became like family. The following is just one of our treks.

I think it was Stu suggested that we go to the Harmonic Convergence in Sedona, Arizona that took place in August 1987. It was kind of a joke to go. In Wikipedia it describes the Harmonic Convergence as the world's first synchronized global peace meditation, marking a significant celestial alignment of the Sun, Moon, and six planets as "part of the grand trine."^{[1][2]} The convergence is purported to have "corresponded with a great shift in the earth's energy from warlike to peaceful.

Well you can judge for yourself how that turned out.

Nevertheless, we were travelling in good-hearted fun with our stuffed toy mascot ET. What ET had to do with our trip and Harmonic Convergence I'll never know and I don't think anyone did. Our party comprised of Janabai, Stu, Gentry, Israel and I. Off to Phoenix we go flying from Los Angeles. I had stopped drinking in July and the rest of our clan were quite tipsy and I had to endure disapproving stares from neighbor lunch tables. As we left we heard someone mutter "And that ET doll"

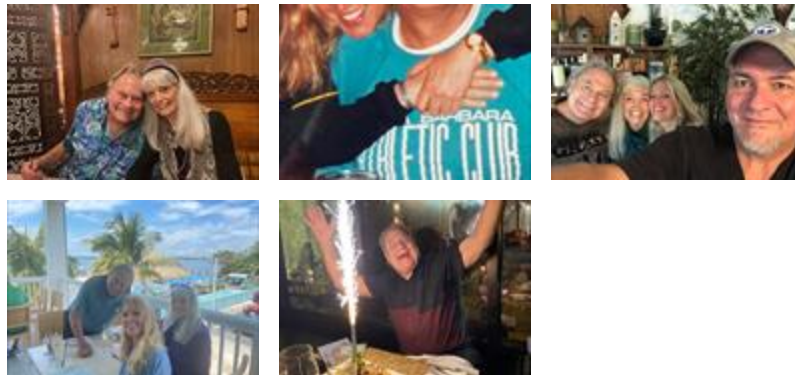
