Thomas G. Sears (73) of Sarasota passed away with his family by his side. He was born in Cambridge Mass to the late George and Beatrice (Carvalho) Sears. In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his daughter Lisa M. Sears.

Tom served in the US Navy. He then began a long career in law enforcement joining the Billerica Police department from 1970 to 1981. Moved to Sarasota and served with the Sarasota Sheriff's department from 1982 to 2002, retiring as a captain.

Tom graduated from Anna Maria College with a Masters degree in criminal justice, University of Lowell with a Bachelor of Science degree and Lowell Technological Institute with an associate degree in technology.

Tom was an ordained minister after retirement and volunteered at the Salvation Army outreach program and Red Cross disaster relief. He loved restoring cars and spending time with family.

Left to cherish his memory are his wife Helen of 53 years; daughters Michelle Urick and Nicole Sears; sisters Jeanne Sousa (husband Joe); Janet Meaney (husband David) of North Port, Florida; cherished grandchildren Chelsea Sears-Coons, Ashleigh Urick and Joey Sears Jurgielewicz; also many

nephews and nieces.

VaVo would utter a few words in Portuguese that only Tommy understood, he spoke the language well.

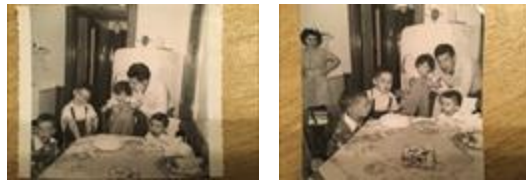
