Willis "Spike" Kellen Link, 97, passed away October 12, 2022. He was born May 5, 1925 in Bloomville, Ohio to the late Willis Kellen and Avis Lavern (Brown) Link.

Spike proudly served in the US Navy during WWII in the Pacific Theater and then graduated from Ohio State University.
